Last year you once again appointed me to continue to represent you to support the Club's objectives under its constitution "2.a. to investigate the subject of bridle tracks and rights of way with a view to opposing those that have been closed and maintaining and more clearly defining those that are in existence" and "2.e. to concern itself with any object which will benefit the horse and horse user in the district".

I have kept you informed, and up to date, in my Bridleway reports, the last of which you have only recently received.

I have, this year, dealt with many rider's bridleway problems and route queries, and defended routes both at SCC's ROW Committees and at Public Inquiry.

I would remind you that the consultation on the Countryside Access Strategy for Shropshire for 2008-2018 ends tomorrow 31st October. It is important that horseriders respond to this document, as it sets out the way forward.

The Government's Lost Ways project is currently working on Shropshire. It is important that riders inform SCC ROW as soon as possible of any routes that should be on the definitive map.

I am still working with Natural England on problems with the permissive Stewardship Routes. Hopefully these will soon be resolved and the corrected map boards available on the website, headed 'Permissive Access' and not as they were previously 'Conservation Walks', and with the routes correctly waymarked and safe to use. I highlighted the problems with the routes in a presentation to the Shropshire Local Access Forum. LAFs are a body set up by the Government, and I represent horseriders' interests on the Shropshire Forum.

Linda Russell and I represent you on the Shropshire Bridleway Groups. We have now been joined by the Carriage Drivers and the title will soon be changing to recognise this.

In September I attended the BHS Access Conference in Bristol, which covered a wide range of subjects with some excellent speakers.

Some of you will have read or heard of the recent extinguishment of a bridleway in Cowley, Oxford by BMW. The case was heard in the local magistrates court at Witney, twenty miles away from the route. The BHS, led by Mark Weston, worked extremely hard on this case defending the public right of way, which is used by horseriders to get to a Country Park. The route is part of an old Roman road, which has been in existence for around two thousand years. If Oxfordshire County Council had lost the case, they had their costs guaranteed by BMW, but Oxfordshire County Council having won, nearly £30,000 of their costs have been awarded against the BHS, a charity! BMW, in exchange for this bridleway being closed, are going to provide only a footpath and cycleway alongside the Oxford Bypass.
